Description: The Office of the Attorney General is seeking applicants for the position of Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Maryland Insurance Administration. This position involves providing advice to the Maryland Insurance Administration (“MIA”) on a broad variety of insurance related issues, including drafting, review, and enforcement of statutes and regulations that govern the conduct of the business of insurance within the State. This position also includes the representation of the MIA before the Office of Administrative Hearings and in state and federal trial and appellate courts.

Experience: The ideal candidate will have at least five years of legal experience, a background in life and health insurance law. Applicants should possess strong writing skills and be prepared to submit a writing sample that demonstrates their proficiency in legal research and analysis and in written advocacy. Experience in representing a regulatory agency or in administrative/regulatory practice is preferred. Experience in procurement related matters is preferred. Maryland Bar required.
