DESCRIPTION: The Attorney General is the chief legal officer of the State of Maryland. The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) has the general charge, supervision, and direction of the legal business of the State, acting as legal advisors and representatives of the major agencies, various boards, commissions, officials, and institutions of State Government. As Maryland's 47th Attorney General, Anthony G. Brown, leads the Office with a key focus on equity, justice, and fairness.

OAG is seeking applicants for the position of Assistant Attorney General in the Independent Investigations Division. The Division was created by the legislature in 2021 to investigate all officer-involved fatalities in the State of Maryland. Beginning October 1, 2023, the Division will have the authority to prosecute such cases as well.

This position will be part of a team of dedicated lawyers, investigators, and other professionals who investigate, evaluate, and—where appropriate—prosecute cases arising from police-involved fatalities. The position requires strong skills in criminal litigation and legal research and writing, with a focus on best practices and sound investigative and prosecutorial techniques. Applicants should feel comfortable working with and meeting with diverse groups, including community groups and law enforcement. On an as-needed basis, the position will require to work outside of normal business hours and travel throughout the State.

EXPERIENCE: The ideal candidate will have at least five years of criminal investigation, litigation, or appellate experience and current or pending admission to the Maryland Bar, or the ability to waive in without delay. Candidates may substitute experience in related fields such as criminal justice policy or law enforcement for up to three years of the above. Preference will be given to applicants with experience relevant to this position, such as law-enforcement investigations, public corruption, homicide, complex litigation, or white-collar crime. The successful candidate will have strong writing skills, with experience researching and drafting briefs and motions, and experience completing in-depth written projects. Current or pending admission to the Maryland Bar, or the ability to waive in without delay, is required.
