Description: The Office of the Attorney General is seeking applicants for an Assistant Attorney General position at the Maryland Aviation Administration ("MAA"). The MAA owns and operates Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI Marshall) and Martin State Airport (MTN). This position will provide advice on a variety of legal issues including: government contracts, real estate matters (such as easements, acquisitions, leases, and land use), noise, commercial transactions, environmental law, personnel, employment, labor, legislation, and the Public Information Act. This position may also represent the MAA in litigation in State and federal courts, and before administrative tribunals, such as the Maryland Office of Administrative Hearings. MAA's legal offices are conveniently located on the third floor of the BWI Marshall Airport Terminal.

Employment Benefits: The successful candidate will be eligible for subsidized health benefits (medical, prescription, dental and vision coverage) and life insurance; leave, including annual (vacation), personal, sick, and paid parental leave, and will be eligible for participation in a contributory defined benefit pension plan in which they are vested after ten years. State employees are eligible to participate in two supplemental retirement plans: [the 457 Deferred Compensation Plan and the 401\(k\) Savings and Investment Plan](#). The State also offers a free mass transit benefit for local bus and express bus services.

Experience: The ideal candidate will have at least five years legal experience, and good research, writing and communication skills. Significant experience in one or more of the following areas is preferred: legislative/regulatory review, real estate, commercial transactions, procurement, and litigation in judicial and administrative forums. Maryland Bar is also required.
