DESCRIPTION: The Attorney General is the chief legal officer of the State of Maryland. The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) has the general charge, supervision, and direction of the legal business of the State, acting as legal advisors and representatives of the major agencies, various boards, commissions, officials, and institutions of State Government. As Maryland's 47th Attorney General, Anthony G. Brown, leads the Office with a key focus on equity, justice, and fairness.

One of Attorney General Brown's top priorities is public safety. As such, the OAG is expanding its Criminal Division and is looking for talented, hardworking individuals who are interested in being a part of that expansion, as we create an even bigger and better Criminal Division to collaborate with local, State, and federal partners to help combat violence, the opioid epidemic, fraud, corruption, and environmental hazards, and keep Marylanders safe.

The OAG's Criminal Division is now seeking applicants for a Deputy Chief of its Fraud and Corruption Unit (FCU). The FCU handles investigations and prosecutions involving fraud and public corruption in Maryland, including bribery, fraud against the state, state employee misconduct, securities fraud, insurance fraud, tax fraud, theft by deception, crimes of exploitation against vulnerable victims, and other criminal violations relating to the integrity of state government and economic justice in courts across Maryland. The Assistant Attorneys General (AAGs) in the FCU, including the Deputy Unit Chief, review referrals and complaints for criminal sufficiency, advise and assist investigators and detectives with open investigations, lead and conduct complex investigations,

collaborate and coordinate with law enforcement and prosecutorial partner agencies; draft and present criminal charging documents, and represent the State of Maryland in the handling of all stages of prosecution.

The Deputy Unit Chief will assist the Unit Chief in supervising the FCU, and in training, guiding, and overseeing the work of AAGs in the FCU. In addition to assisting the Unit Chief with all of the above, the Deputy Unit Chief will also manage their own docket of investigations and trials.

EXPERIENCE: The ideal candidate will have at least 5 years of criminal litigation experience including experience investigating and prosecuting complex financial crimes and experience with grand jury practice. The ideal candidate will have a passion for investigative and trial work, strong abilities to build and maintain relationships with victims, witnesses, and law enforcement, along with excellent legal research, writing, and oral advocacy skills. Maryland Bar membership, or the eligibility to waive in immediately, is required.
