Description: The Office of the Attorney General is seeking applicants for the position of Deputy Counsel to the Maryland Insurance Administration. Deputy Counsel works closely with Principal Counsel to provide advice to the Insurance Commissioner and key officials within the Insurance Administration on a broad variety of insurance related issues. Deputy Counsel supervises and manages the representation of the Maryland Insurance Administration before the Office of Administrative Hearings and in state and federal trial and appellate courts and frequently appears on behalf of the Administration in significant matters.

Experience: Minimum requirements for this position include a law degree and seven years of trial and appellate experience. Applicants must have strong organizational skills and the ability to supervise and manage a litigation docket. Applicants should also possess strong oral advocacy and writing skills and should be prepared to submit a writing sample that demonstrates their proficiency in legal research and analysis and in written advocacy. A background in insurance law, health law, or corporate law and experience in representing a regulatory agency is preferred. Maryland Bar membership required.
