Description: The Office of the Attorney General is seeking applicants for an Assistant Attorney General in the Civil Division. The Civil Division represents Maryland state agencies and officials, in the state and federal trial and appellate courts, in the most important civil litigation that the State confronts. In addition to handling trial and appellate cases, the Division reviews and approves all civil complaints, notices of appeal, and appellate briefs filed on behalf of the State; approves settlements in civil cases; conducts moot courts in all civil appeals; and serves as a general resource and advisor on litigation matters to the divisions and units of the Office of the Attorney General.

Experience: The ideal candidate will have a minimum of five years of legal experience, including experience with complex civil litigation; an outstanding academic record; excellent written and oral advocacy skills; and the intellect and creativity to handle sophisticated legal issues. Other factors that will enhance an application include a state or federal judicial clerkship and work on a law journal. Maryland Bar membership is required.
