Description: The Office of the Attorney General is seeking applicants for an Assistant Attorney General to represent the Charles County Department of Social Services (“CCDSS”). This position represents CCDSS in the circuit court in child welfare proceedings, including Child in Need of Assistance (“CINA”), Termination of Parental Rights (“TPR”), and adult protective services cases. The position would also represent CCDSS before the Office of Administrative Hearings in child abuse, neglect, and other hearings when the attorney regularly assigned to those cases is unavailable or when participation is otherwise necessary. This position also provides general agency advice and counsel to CCDSS in child welfare and adult services matters.

Experience: The ideal candidate will have at least three years of legal experience and admission to the Maryland Bar. Experience in child welfare is preferred.
