**DESCRIPTION:** The Attorney General is the chief legal officer of the State of Maryland. The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) has the general charge, supervision, and direction of the legal business of the State, acting as legal advisors and representatives of the major agencies, various boards, commissions, officials and institutions of State Government. As Maryland's 47th Attorney General, Anthony G. Brown, leads the Office with a key focus on equity, justice, and fairness.

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking candidates for the position of Assistant Attorney General in the Consumer Protection Division to work as part of a team of attorneys responsible for the State's opioids investigations and litigation and related matters involving significant legal issues impacting the health and safety of the residents of the State. The position will involve investigation of sales and marketing practices and civil and administrative trial and appellate litigation.

**EXPERIENCE:** The ideal candidate will have at least three years of legal experience, which may include one or more judicial clerkship(s); an outstanding academic record; excellent research, writing, and oral advocacy skills; and the intellect and creativity to handle sophisticated legal and factual issues. Experience in complex civil litigation (such as class action, mass tort, multidistrict, food and drug, or similar litigation) is desirable. Interest or experience handling complex issues at the intersection of law and science is a plus.
